Abutilon vitifolium seeds -(Abutilon, Indian Mallow)	This extremely beautiful member of the mallow family is sought after by gardeners for its clusters of large saucer -shaped soft blue-purple flowers., which are upward facing unlike other abutilons. They can range from the occasional white form through pale to deep purple. The leaves are somewhat like a grape's, five lobed, like grey felt in appearance, dull green to grey above and lighter underneath, and are downy to touch. Flowers tend to be short lived but there is a great profusion produced in the summer months, and where it thrives it brightens up the garden in the summer months.	4.9
Achillea filipendulina 'Parkers Variety' seeds - (Fern Leaf Yarrow)	This achillea has long ferny leaves, which are grey - green and aromatic. The flower heads are large and flat and are composed of tens of small bright yellow flowers, which make extremely good cut flowers. The plants form a vigorous clump and are frost hardy. Achillea filipendulina 'Parkers Variety' won the prestigious Royal Horticultural Award of Garden Merit.	4.9
Achillea millefolium 'Cerise Queen' seeds - (Yarrow)	This plant has rosy red flowers. It is drought tolerant and so makes a great xeriscape plant, and is useful for natural landscaping as well as being an excellent garden plant. Bees and other beneficial insects are attracted to it, and it makes an excellent cut flower and does well in a container. It flowers in the first year from seed about 4 months after germination.	4.9
Achillea millefolium	This mix will give flowers in colours of pink, red, white , apricot,	4.9

'Colorado' seeds - (Yarrow)	beige, bronze and yellow. It flowers from Spring right through until the first frosts. It will flower four months after sowing. It likes well drained soil which is a little lean, but will adapt to most soils and can tolerate full sun and humid warm summers. It is suited to pots or containers and the flowers dry well. It tends to spread a little, so plan to divide the clumps in Spring or autumn to ensure it stays compact. The foliage is narrow mid green grey in colour and fern like, and forms a compact basal mound. It should be trimmed back to the basal leaves encourage further flowering. It flowers in the first year from seed.	
Achillea millefolium 'Favorite Berries'	This mix is an excellent one for adding highlights to the garden, and is of course a great cut flower. You will get plants with flowers of cerise pink, shades of pink and red, apricot and peach, lavender, and colours in between. It flowers the first year from seed, about 4 months after germination.	4.9
Acmella oleracia f dark leaved seeds - (Bulls eye)	This an attractive small plant for edgings or the front of the border, and for containers. It has small round flowers which are a yellow brown, and each flower has a dark burgundy eye at its centre. Its flowers and leaves contain Spilanthol, an analgesic used medicinally for numbing toothaches.	4.9
Aconitum carmichaelii Arendsii-Group seeds - (Monkshood, Chinese Aconite)	This is considered to be one of the best late summer and autumn flowering plants. It has very attractive tall branching flower stems which bear many beautiful, hooded, dark blue flowers. It has a sturdy habit and can be planted in pots. It has been awarded the Award of Garden Merit by the Royal Horticultural Society. Note: All parts of this plant, including the roots are poisonous	4.9
Aconitum carmichaeill'Spatliese'	This plant has very pretty pale cobalt blue flowers which of a good size The flowers are produced on well branched heads in statuesque pyramids, with many side shoots to show off their beauty, and the dark	4.90

	green glossy foliage is also very attractive. This plant belongs to the Wilsonii group, whose plants are more branched than other aconitums. It will die down in winter, but comes up again reliably in spring. They make excellent cut flowers, but be careful of the cut ends.	
Agastache aurantianca 'Apricot Sprite'		4.90
Agastache pallidiflora 'Rose Mint'	This small growing aromatic leaved plant produces a continual mass of lavender-rose scented flowers. The flowers are produced from spring through to late autumn. It makes a lovely border plant and can also be used in a container.	4.90
Agastache rugosa f. albiflora	Agastache albiflora is an easily grown plant whose hooded white flowers are beloved all beneficial insects. It is a good subject for natural landscaping where its aromatic foliage and its flowers which are a magnet to bees, sits easily in a natural garden. Agastache is a plant which requires very low maintenance, and it is used traditionally for scent, tea and medical applications. It does well in a container as it is quite hardy, give it plenty of room. The plant flowers the first year from seed about 4 months after germination.	4.90
Agastache rupestris 'Apache Sunset'	This is considered to be one of the best flowering and hardiest of the agastaches. It has handsome sunset pink to burnt orange flowers, which flower for a long time, and are good for cutting. The fine feathery silvery foliage is also attractive, and aromatic.	4.90
Ageratum houstonianum 'Timeless mix'	This plant mix has pretty fluffy flowers in shades of blue, pink, mauve, burgundy and white. The flowers grow on a well branched bushy plant. The flowers are good as a cut flower because they have tall study stems and provide a light airy texture to bouquets. But they are also a valuable plant in the garden, where the mid green, heart shaped foliage with scalloped edges creates a useful foil for the flowers. The flowers are produced throughout light scent. Remove the old flowers to encourage further flowering, and tidy up the plant. The plant likes a position in full	

	sun, with moist well drained soil, though will tolerate partial shade, and doesn't have many pest and disease problems. It grows easily from seed, and can be used in containers as well as in the garden. It flowers in the first year from seed, about 3 months from germination. the summer, and bees and butterflies are attracted to their light scent. Remove the old flowers to encourage further flowering, and tidy up the plant. The plant likes a position in full sun, with moist well drained soil, though will tolerate partial shade, and doesn't have many pest and disease problems. It grows easily from seed, and can be used in containers as well as in the garden. It flowers in the first year from seed, about 3 months from germination.	
Agrostemma githago 'Queen Mix'	Agrostemma 'Queen Mix' produces dainty flowers in a mix of white, pink and lavender. It is a long flowering tall plant which makes an excellent cut flower, and lends an airy grace to a mixed border. Landscape gardeners, designing wild meadows use agrostemma in their wildflower fields, as they grow very well from scattered seed, and are not bothered by many pests. However they are quite tough plants, for all their delicate seeming flowers and stems. They also blend well with other wild flowers and look very pretty if planted in a group. They make a very good cut flower lasting well in the vase. They are one of the timeless flowers which gardeners over the years have cherished, coming originally from the British cornfields where they grew wild. Sadly they have all but died out in the wild.	
Alcea ficifolia 'Happy Lights' seeds - (Fig leaved hollyhock)	Happy lights is a beautiful strain. It is a blend of white, pink, purple, red, and yellow blooms. It makes a bushy plant rather than having a single spire like the traditional hollyhocks, and will also flower in the first year from seed if sown early enough (May - September). This is a much more robust form of the common hollyhock native to Siberia. If you have problems with hollyhock rust then try this variety which is much more rust resistant. The plants grow to around 150 to 210cm tall, and produce large, single saucer shaped flowers that are 8 to 12cm wide from November to April. They make excellent cut flowers.	4.9

	It should be cut back after flowering, and prefers a moderately fertile well drained soil. This strain is easy to grow from seed, and is extremely hardy. It likes rich soil and full sun.	
Alcea rugosa var nigra 'Jet Black'	This hollyhock has the deepest dark maroon red flowers which appear almost black in colour. Alcea 'Jet Black' is an old- fashioned plant, dating back to the 17 century. It has been very popular with gardeners through the years. This alcea performs well in most situations, and its tall nearly black single flowers are produced each year, benefiting the garden design with its structural properties. The plant dies down in winter, to a small rosette in warm temperatures and in cold ones will lose its leaves entirely. It will re-emerge in spring, and the flowers will take your breath away, they are so beautiful. Plant them along paths to provide a nice outline and fences to show off their beauty.	4.90
Alcea rosea-hyb 'Purple Raimn'	Unlike other rosea species hollyhocks which are biennial, this is a true perennial hollyhock strain and will come up each year for you, and flower for you with a minimum of care and fuss. It is a very handsome perennial hollyhock, which has dark purple-blue single flowers. If you sow it early enough in spring, it will flower in the first year for you. It is an easy plant to grow from seed, and requires little care and maintenance. Hollyhocks make an architectural statement in your garden adding interest with their remarkable pyramid shape. Try planting a row of them down a path leading to your house.	7.30
Alcea rosea-hybr 'Radiant Rose'	Unlike other rosea species hollyhocks, this hollyhock is a true perennial hollyhock strain and will come up each year for you. and flower for you with a minimum of care and fuss. It is a very handsome perennial hollyhock, which has bright pink single flowers. If you sow it early enough in spring, it will flower in the first year for you. It is an easy plant to grow from seed, and requires little care and maintenance. Hollyhocks make an architectural statement in your garden adding interest with their remarkable pyramid shape. Try planting a row of them down a path leading to your house.	7.30

Alcea rugosa seeds	This very pretty hollyhock has large single soft yellow flowers to 90cm tall. It is resistant to Hollyhock rust, and looks dramatic in groups or planted against a fence for support.	4.9
Alchemilla mollis 'Select' seeds	This is an outstanding and easily grown plant for the shady border. It is a very beautiful small foliage plant, whose leaves catch the early morning dew and rain and capture the drops in their cupped leaves keeping them hanging like sparkling diamond drops. This selection has strong stems and very uniform foliage and is bred to be a more upright form of alchemilla. It has large clusters of many tiny chartreuse green flowers which are held above the leaves, in sprays. Both leaves and flowers can be used in flower arrangements. Can be grown in pots.	4.9
Alstroemeria ligtu 'Dandy Candy mix'	This mix has bright colours: red, deep rose and picotee-type white with pink. They have particularly large flowers, which have dark stripes and yellow markings. They make an excellent cut flower lasting for about 2 weeks in the vase, and flower for weeks in the garden.	7.90
Amaranthus caudatus 'Emerald tassels'	This is a green flowering amaranthus, which fits in beautifully in all flower bouquet colours, with its trailing emerald flowers It is a splendid plant for the garden with its lovely architectural weeping form and of course makes an excellent cut flower	4.90
Amaranthus caudatus 'Coral Fountain'	This plant has unusual coral-pink tassels, and is an attractive form for flower arrangements with its weeping tassels. If you stake it upright it looks beautiful in the garden border, blending in with most other flowers.	4.9
Amaranthus cruentus 'Hot Biscuits' seeds	This is an upright amaranthus which has long rich copper seed heads which are excellent when used as a highlight amongst pale flowers in the garden. It makes a very good long lasting cut flower.	4.9
Ammobium alatum seeds - (Winged everlasting)	Ammobium alatum is an attractive perennial plant. It is an Australian native. It has silver toned foliage which offsets the numerous small papery white flowers, which have big golden centres. It is a great flower for the garden flowering over an extended period in summer.	4.9

	\nlt is a useful cut flower adding substance to bouquets. The flowers can also be dried. It is a hardy plant, which likes a sunny spot and can be spectacular en masse. However it is best treated as a annual in cold conditions.	
Anemone huphensis 'Rose Beauty'	This anemone mixture has pretty, single, white to rose pink flowers in late summer and flowering into autumn. It is a valuable plant for the garden as it flowers profusely, giving a lovely, slightly aetherial display, just as the rest of the garden is beginning to look past its best. Also, as a bonus, Anemone 'Rose Beauty' makes a good cut flower. It dies down in the winter, coming back again in the spring with dark green leaves in a nice rounded bush. These plants are undemanding and easy care. They will grow in many situations from partial shade to full sunlight.	4.90
Anemone multifida rubra 'Anabella Deep Red'	This plant forms a low mound of green leaves which are shaped somewhat like a fern. In late spring it produces a lovely display of single deep-rose, carmine red, long-stemmed open flowers with a pale-yellow centre in profusion. It does not need any special attention. The flowers produce attractive fluffy seedheads after they have finished blooming which add interest to the garden in winter. This plant flowers best in full sun on rich, well-drained soil. It's a good choice for a rock garden, a mixed border, or the edge of a woodland. It is drought tolerant, and resistant to rabbits. Butterflies are attracted to it. It makes an excellent container plant.	4.90
Anigozanthos flavidus	These Anigozanthos flavidus seeds will produce flowers in red shades . The flowers are prized for their lasting ability in a vase and make excellent cut flowers. The plant likes to grow in full sun and is not fussy as to the soil type, growing in a wide range of situations. It is a long lived plant lasting for up to 30 years in a garden, and takes very little care. Kangaroo paws make very good container plants being tough plants which can survive less than ideal conditions.	4.90
Anigozanthos humilis	This australian native plant has flowers in shades of red or orange or yellow. It flowers in winter through to spring when very little other colour is in the garden. It is a fantastic cut flower with stems reaching a metre sometimes. The plant can tolerate hot humid climates. It is frost tender and is best planted in sunny situations with well drained soil. Put it in a	4.90

	container and it will do well for you, attracting birds and bees with its nectar rich flowers.	
Anigozanthos manglesii seeds - (Kangaroo Paw)	This kangaroo paw is a well known one, as it is the western Australian floral emblem. It has red and green velvety flowers which are borne on long stems up to 120 cm. They make an excellent cut flower, and will flower in their second year from seed. The plants themselves grow well in sandy and gravelly well drained soils in full sun to part shade, and form clumps of strap-like leaves. They will do well in the garden, provided that they are protected from snails and slugs which love them. They can also be used as pot plants, and look good on a balcony. They are attractive to birds which love their nectar. The plant tolerates light frost only, so if your region gets heavy frost, then grow it as a potted plant so you can move it under shelter.	4.9
Antirrhinum majus 'F1 Rocket Series Orchid' seeds - (Snapdragon)	This plant is a very good garden specimen and also an excellent cut flower. It has pretty Orchid pink flowers, and the series is an AAS (All-American Selections) Winner. The Rocket Series antirrhinums were specifically bred for the ability to withstand heat, and to bloom in summer. In temperate climates they are winter hardy. If you cut the deadheads back on the first blooming, the plant will produce a second blooming.	4.9
Antirrhinum majus 'Giant Cherry'	Antirrhinum 'Giant Cherry' plants have warm glowing cherry red flowers and are excellent as a cut flower and for the garden. they are very easy to grow from seed and don't like to be too hot, performing well in temperature ranges between 15 -20 deg C.	4.90
Antirrhinum majus 'Giant Scarlet'	This brilliant scarlet snapdragon is a wonderful garden plant and also an excellent cut flower. It will grow to about 90 cm for you	4.90
Antirrhinum majus 'Giant White'	This sparkling white snapdragon is a wonderful garden plant and also an excellent cut flower. It will grow to about 90 cm for you	4.90
Antirrhinum majus	Antirrhinum 'Maryland Appleblossom' is an excellent snapdragon for the	4.90

It is a very early flowering antirrhinum, which flowers prolifically even in cool dull weather, but it can also tolerate hot weather as well. It makes a good container plant where it can perform to its best and show off its lovely flowers	
Antirrhinum majus 'Rust Resistant Giants Mix' seeds - (Snapdragon)	This antirrhinum strain is better at resisting the antirrhinum rust. It has very large flowers in a wide range of colours, is excellent for cutting and performs well in the garden	4.9
Antirrhinum majus F1 'Chantilly Bronze' seeds - (Snapdragon)	This snapdragon has open faced flowers of an attractive salmon/tangerine colour. It makes an excellent cut flower and performs well in cooler conditions. Its flowers are edible and can be used as a garnish, though the flowers have a floral slightly bitter taste.	4.9
Apium graveolens 'Chinese Pink' seeds - (Celery)	This is a uniquely coloured celery being a real lollipop pink, which does not lose its colour when cooked unlike many other vegetables. It has a strong and slightly sweet flavour and is probably best eaten young. Plant it quite close together and make new sowings every now and then. They like full sun and rich moist soil.	4.9
Aquilegia atrata seeds	This aquilegia is a lovely free flowering plant which has flowers of the deepest black red on many branching stems up to 60 cm and is a sought after species plant for the summer garden. It blooms in late spring and early summer. It prefers rich soils which have a good deal of humous and full sun or partial shade. It is frost hardy. It will do well in containers also.	4.9
Aquilegia x hybrida 'McKana's Giant Mix' seeds - (Granny's Bonnet)	This strain of aquilegia has very large flowers which have lovely combinations of white, pink, blue, yellow, pink, pale-blue, purple and scarlet, with clear coloured outer petals, and cream/white coloured inner petals. It will grow well in shady areas and will grow to about 75 cm tall. It blooms every year reliably, and makes a great show with its lovely, long spurred bi-coloured flowers and	4.9

	makes a good cut flower. It makes an excellent container plant.	
Aquilegia vulgaris 'Winky Double Rose Whote'	This aquilegia has upright facing double pink and rose flowers, unlike other aquilegias which hang their heads down. The flowers are produced in profusion on very strong stems. It performs well in the garden, smothering itself in pretty pink and white flowers. It is an easy care plant which will come up each year for you without fuss. It will reward you, for giving it a place in your garden, with not only its flowers, but also with its pretty fern like lacy foliage. It can also be used as an extremely attractive pot plant, if you keep it watered.	10.50
Armeria maritima-hybr	Armeria 'Ornament' is a no fuss easy care little plant which forms small neat and tidy cushions of green leaves in your garden bed . From these cushions appear flowers in shades of red, pink lilac and white . The flowers are larger than the usual armeria and make good cut flowers. The plant likes well drained soil, which is a little on the dry side and can tolerate some drought.	4.90
Artemisia absinthium seeds - (Wormwood)	Artemisia absinthium is grown chiefly for its silver green-grey foliage which adds interesting texture to garden plantings. It has a bushy growth habit. It is used for natural landscaping and for xeriscaping and for plantings where low maintenance is required. It is attractive to butterflies and other pollinators. The foliage is highly aromatic when crushed. It is also used as a medicinal plant and tea herb. It makes a good container plant for large pots.	4.9
Artemisia annua 'Sweet Annie' seeds - (Sweet wormwood)	This plant is a lovely fine and fragrant filler for flower bouquets, with its filagree leaves like that of a fern. It can also be used dry for winter dried arrangements. It is an ancient chinese medicinal herb.	4.9
Artemisia lactiflora seeds - (White Mugwort)	This plant has creamy white panicles of sweetly scented tiny white flowers which attract butterflies and bees. It is like a delicate giant white astilbe, which flowers from late summer into late autumn in warmer areas, on slightly curved arching stems. It won an Award of	4.9

	Garden Merit from the RHS in 1993. For those of you who want a plant which will fit well into natural landscaping and perennial borders, this is a good one. Although it prefers moist soils, it tolerates drought well and the green silver backed leaves have an aromatic scent. It is easy to grow, and will tolerate part shade. It makes a good cut flower. Cut back in the autumn.	
Artemisia Iudoviciana	This plant is grown for its wonderful silver grey foliage, which lights up the plants which it is placed next to in the border with its lovely contrasting foliage. Its foliage is aromatic when you touch and bruise it. It produces small yellow flowers which are inconspicuous, but pleasantly scented which makes it nice for an outdoor seating area. The experts recommend these are removed to prevent self seeding. The plant spreads by rhizomes, and in some situations can self seed, so keep an eye out for unwanted growth. It can withstand some dry conditions, and likes well drained soil in full sun. Cut it back to the ground in autumn. Its foliage is excellent for floral arrangements, and makes a good container plant.	4.90
Aruncus aethusifolius	This plant has beautiful fine feathery foliage, from which arise pretty white flowers, on red flushed stems. The flowers smother the small bush Aruncus aethusifolius gained the award of Perennial Plant of the Year in Sweden in 2010 and also the RHS 'Award of Merit'. It makes a good cut flower. Plant it in full sun down in southern cool summer climates and in the north plant it in semi-shade	4.90
Asclepias curassavica 'Silky Gold' seeds	This milkweed has clusters of 10cm golden yellow flowers on long stems. It makes a good cut flower, is showy in the garden and is very attractive to honey bees and butterflies particularly the monarch.	4.90
Asclepias incarnata 'Soulmate'	Asclepias 'Soulmate' is a preferred plant for the monarch butterfly. It has clusters of pink flowers which have the scent of vanilla,	4.90

	which likes moist clay soils, and makes a very attractive garden plant.	
Asphodeline lutea seeds - (Yellow Candle, Kings Spear)	This plant has handsome spikes of unusual spear shaped, fragrant yellow flowers which rise well above the foliage to create a striking display in the garden. The strap like foliage is a blue green colour, and the flower makes a good cut flower and is attractive to bees and other pollinating insects. It is an evergreen, clumping plant which is tolerant of most soils and can be used in dry places.	4.9
Aster callistephus chinensis 'Giant Ray White' seeds - (Giant Quilled Aster)	Aster 'Giant Ray White' produces extra large peony type flowers in a clear white. The flowers are borne on bushy well-branched plants. It is sought after for its finely pointed petals which create a frilly effect. It makes an excellent cut flower as well as a great display in the garden. It is an annual and as it grows to approx 60cm, it has good, long stems for cutting. It prefers a sunny position, in well drained soil.	4.9
Aster callistephus chinensis 'Tiger Paw Sea Star Mix ' seeds	The flowers on these plants come in a lovely range of colours from whites and creams through pink shades and blues to purples . Each flower is a lovely shape and is a very large size. The flowers are bred for the cut flower market so they are excellent for cutting and last well in a vase , but they are also very lovely massed in the garden, where they perform well and fill those awkward spaces where you just want something to bloom freely for the summer months.	4.9
Aster tongolensis 'Wartburg Star'	This very showy aster is unlike any other aster. It is prized by florists as it is an excellent, long lasting cut flower. It bears beautiful rich violet blue flowers all through summer, with golden centres. The 5 cm flowers are produced singly, on lovely long wiry 30 cm stems which are perfect for cutting, and the blue daisies are produced in masses. They are loved by all pollinating insects. This plant will spread by rhizomes gradually, ending up eventually as a clump about 40 – 50 cm wide. It likes full sun and moderately fertile

Astrantia major seeds - (Great Masterwort)	This plant is both long flowering and long lived. It has very showy star shaped heads from which pink, green or white bracts radiate wafting a sweet scent. Each blossom is an umbel of tiny flowers surrounded by a whorl of papery bracts. It flowers continuously throughout summer and autumn. It prefers part shade and rich moist soil, with cooler night time temperatures in the summer, and is very useful for that shady spot where many other sun lovers will not grow. It is not common in most gardens, but should be better known and cultivated according to many knowledgeable gardeners It is native to Central and Eastern Europe. Astrantia make excellent, long lasting cut flowers.	4.9
Banksia ashbyi ssp boreoscala	This very attractive, smaller growing banksia is ideal for a smaller garden, growing to 1.5 * 1.5 m. It has attractive serrated grey green foliage and produces large orange, candle like flowers which are set off well against the leaves. The flowers are nectar rich and bees and birds are attracted to them. The plant forms a dense rounded bush. Penstemon whippleanus cold treated	Penstemon whippleanus is a mat forming plant which has wonderful dark purple to dark blue flowers in spring and summer. Phlomis russeliana seeds - (Jerusalem Sage)	Phlomis Russeliana is a popular plant due to its long flowering season. It produces, at intervals, long stems of soft yellow whorled flowers from late spring into autumn, above lush and dramatic heart shaped green leaves. Each plant forms an architectural candelabra-like effect in the garden, and as a bonus in autumn the flowers turn to handsome seed heads, which add drama to the autumn garden.	4.9

	Although appearing ethereal and tender, this plant is a hardy specimen to about - 15 degrees C. and the beautiful leaf rosettes are evergreen over winter. In addition, Phlomis Russeliana is drought hardy and is an excellent plant for dry partial shade or a dry site in full sun. It tolerates poor, dry soil extremely well. It requires very little maintenance. When the foliage becomes untidy, from late summer onward, it may be cut back to encourage new growth. If left alone some people enjoy the form of this plant, especially during the snow when it appears as white fluffy snow covered balls raised on their stalks. It is a valuable and easy-togrow plant and attracts bees and other nectar loving insects during its flowering period. To extend flowering, deadhead the spent flowers, this also makes for a tidier-looking plant. Large clumps should be divided every three years in autumn-winter to remove excess growth. Can be planted in a container, but this should be quite a large one, and don't make the soil too rich. The Royal Horticultural Society awarded the prestigious Award of Garden Merit (AGM) to Phlomis russeliana in 1993.	
Phlomis tuberosa 'Bronze Flamingo' seeds - (Jerusalem Sage)	Phlomis tuberosa 'Bronze Flamingo' produces abundant lavender pink hooded flowers, which are borne on dark burgundy stems. The plant lends an architectural quality to the garden and blooms from late spring through summer. It is hardy in most parts of New Zealand, and if you live in an area which gets frost or snow then you will be delighted with the striking sight of hoar frost on the seed heads. The dried seed heads make good additions to a floral arrangement. It likes full sun with well drained fertile soil and medium moisture, but can also tolerate some drought and thus is useful in dry gardens. It is attractive to bees and butterflies.
